What is it?

A short-term alternative to inpatient psychiatric services

Available on site where the youth is; home or community

exceptions include inpatient settings, jails or detention centers, or residential settings (e.g. Child Caring Institutions)

Provided by a team of two staff who help stabilize the youths emotional or behavioral functioning and de-escalate the crisis

Staff can help coordinate or refer to services for continued stabilization

Who Qualifies

Youth 0-21 years old and their parents/ caregivers;

Who are eligible as having a serious emotional disturbance (SED), intellectual or developmental disability (I/DD), or co-occurring SED and substance use disorders;

Have Medicaid eligibility;

Live in _____ counties, and are;

Experiencing a crisis, defined by the parent or caregiver, beyond the caregivers capacity to manage. Examples may include:

- aggression
- property destruction
- dangerous decision making
- threatening behaviors
- social isolation
- self harm or suicidal thoughts

If the child you are caring for appears to be in crisis but not requiring immediate emergency assistance, please call
